# TIMELINE OF OASIS

An historical look at our story and God's faithfulness

## January 2014

Oasis' first Sunday morning service is held in the 'cafetorium' of Holly Grove Middle School in Holly Springs.



First Baptism held on March 16, 2014

## August 2016

Oasis launches the Here for Good Project - a dedication to serving our community and initial capital campaign for future permanence with pledges totalling \$520,000.



## October 2016

Oasis outgrows Holly Grove Middle School and relocates 1/2 mile away to Holly Springs High School with two Sunday morning services.



## July 2018

Oasis closes on the purchase of 1828 Ralph Stephens Road from the Barrow family - originally listed for \$1.5M - for \$1M, owner financed at 0% interest.

## March 2020

Oasis cancels in-person gatherings for "two weeks" due to the COVID-19 pandemic moving to online streaming only, broadcasting from the 'church house' offices on our property.

## November 2020

Demo of the 'church house' takes place allowing for commencement of the site work with an early grading permit at 1828 Ralph Stephens Road.

## June 2021

After 16 months of virtual services, Oasis gathers at Holly Springs High School again on Sunday morning.

## February 2022

After 3 years of designing, planning, and engineering, vertical construction of the new Phase I of the Oasis Church building begins.

## June 2022

Oasis held an 'open house' event entitled "1828" providing a first look and opportunities to engage in a self-guided tour, activities, and prayer.



## December 2022

On Sunday, December 18, 2022 the first services were held at the new permanent home of Oasis Church, 1828 Ralph Stephens Road.



# SEPTEMBER 2023

Oasis adds a third Sunday morning service to accommodate the growth and launches Oasis Academy to help people dive deeper in their understanding of God.



# Meet Jairus

**J**airus was a ruler in the synagogue in the time of Jesus in Capernaum, a fishing village in Galilee with a population of 1,000 to 1,500 people. He was chosen to care for the physical arrangements of the synagogue services – arranging Scripture readings, bringing out the Torah scrolls at appropriate times, enforcing rules and traditions, and determining who would speak in services. He was also responsible for maintaining the building and its premises – he oversaw the **facility**.

In both the Gospel of Mark and the Gospel of Luke, we meet Jairus. He's easily overshadowed by the miracles Jesus provides in healing a woman dealing with a blood issue and raising a girl from the dead – and rightfully so. But when we look deeper at these stories, we see that these miracles are happening because of great **faith** that Jesus is more than able to do all that He says He can do.

It's here that we see Jairus in the role of the father. His daughter is the one dying. He goes to Jesus, hoping He will heal and restore her. Before Jesus gets to her, she dies. But Jesus does the unimaginable – He raises her back to life. Jairus' daughter receives new life and complete restoration through Jesus – because of Jairus' great faith in who Jesus is and Jairus' love for the **next generation**.

The three pillars we see in Jairus' life are the pillars on which we see the next phase of Oasis Church being built – faith, facilities, and the next generation.

This is **THE JAIRUS PROJECT**: a faith that grows, a stewardship that strengthens, and a love that leaves a legacy.




## How to prepare and participate in the Jairus Project

### I ATTEND OASIS EACH SUNDAY

Committing to attend Oasis each week through the story of Jairus (and beyond!) won't just build a healthy rhythm in your life, it will help you catch the vision behind everything we're doing at Oasis. Use the next few pages to take notes of what God reveals to you through the series.

### II CONNECT IN COMMUNITY

Participating in the community ensures that you aren't doing life alone and enables you to grow together with people around you. Get involved in a group, a serving team, or a ministry offering and prioritize your involvement.

### III COMMIT TO GIVE FINANCIALLY

Committing to contribute financially has the power to help build your faith, the ministry of Oasis, and a legacy for the next generation.

## EASTER IS COMING

Lent is the 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter. Lent is often described as a time of preparation and an opportunity to go deeper with God. It's a time for personal reflection that prepares people's hearts and minds for Good Friday and Easter. The three main things people focus on during Lent are prayer, fasting (giving up something to reduce distractions and focus more on God) and giving, or charity.

Take a moment and think of something that you could give up for a month. Whatever the sacrifice, calculate what you save. Your invitation - between now and Easter - is to use these resources to bless someone in your life. This could be a friend or family member, neighbor or co-worker that you want to see attend Oasis. It could be someone in need you meet on the street. It may empower you to buy lunch for someone you've committed to praying for.

Regardless of who it is, take time over these next few weeks to be a blessing to someone with the resources entrusted to you. Once you've done it, take a few minutes to journal about what you did and your experience, then share it with your small group.

## LUKE CHAPTER VIII

41 Then a man named Jairus, who was a leader of the synagogue, came up. Falling at Jesus' feet, he pleaded with him to come to his house, 42 because he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, and she was dying.

As Jesus was on his way, the crowds pressed around him. 43 Now a woman was there who had been suffering from a hemorrhage for twelve years but could not be healed by anyone. 44 She came up behind Jesus and touched the edge of his cloak, and at once the bleeding stopped. 45 Then Jesus asked, "Who was it who touched me?" When they all denied it, Peter said, "Master, the crowds are surrounding you and pressing against you!" 46 But Jesus said, "Someone touched me, for I know that power has gone out from me." 47 When the woman saw that she could not escape notice, she came trembling and fell down before him. In the presence of all the people, she explained why she had touched him and how she had been immediately healed. 48 Then he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace."

49 While he was still speaking, someone from the synagogue leader's house came and said, "Your daughter is dead; do not trouble the teacher any longer." 50 But when Jesus heard this, he told him, "Do not be afraid; just believe, and she will be healed." 51 Now when he came to the house, Jesus did not let anyone go in with him except Peter, John, and James, and the child's father and mother. 52 Now they were all wailing and mourning for her, but he said, "Stop your weeping; she is not dead but asleep!" 53 And they began making fun of him, because they knew that she was dead. 54 But Jesus gently took her by the hand and said, "Child, get up." 55 Her spirit returned, and she got up immediately. Then he told them to give her something to eat. 56 Her parents were astonished, but he ordered them to tell no one what had happened.

Looking through all the seasons of my life, God's hand has been in every single moment. He has been my freedom and my redeemer.

There was a time in my life when I was far from understanding His transforming power. At 15, I was insecure, caught up with the wrong friends, and unhappy with the person I was becoming. I felt anxious about each day and spent many nights overthinking. Though this is common for a young girl, I realized that the root of my anxiety was my need to control every single moment. I have always had a Type A personality, but I used it to grip onto worldly things and tried to be my own savior. I was taking the place that I so desperately needed God to fill.

I thought that if I strived for perfection, I wouldn't have anxiety. This mindset led me to struggle mentally, feeling unsure of where I belonged and pressured me to feel I must do everything right. This wasn't due to anyone around me, but was a result of my own mind tricking me into thinking that I needed to be perfect to be worthy of praise, love, and goodness.

With the support of my parents, the Lord met me during this time. It took one moment of pure exhaustion and a tearful cry to the Lord for Him to hear me. He touched past my heart and into my soul. Amidst all my spinning thoughts, His one crystal-clear voice brought me pure peace, saying, "You are going to be okay." That was all it took. I felt an immediate wave of realization that God hears me. My attempts to control every outcome were breaking me down mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. After that moment, God started building me up. I began to pick up His word, armoring myself with what He says about me instead of what others do. I sat in His presence for peace rather than worrying about the future. I used my "what ifs" to point to the Lord guiding my life.

During this time of learning about God, we received a flyer for Oasis—a new church launching in Holly Springs. This was a huge sign for both me and my family to attend. Through services as a family, we became immersed in who God is and how His love is truly all we need. We were baptized as a family in the first baptism service at Oasis, and I immediately



got involved with Oasis Kids. I felt that if I could even have a small part in helping a child grow up placing their value and identity in the truth Christ provides, I had served God well.


Over the years, I was called to lead a women's ministry in college despite feeling unqualified. I saw God's hand equipping and strengthening me even when I struggled. After graduating, I became involved in Oasis Kids and the Oasis Young Adult group. Being placed at this church and in these groups was no accident. God saw me and my family in a crucial time and led us here. The community at Oasis has pushed me, led me, supported me, and educated me on my walk with Christ in ways I never imagined.

God is teaching me what true reliance on Him looks like and how to use my blessings to bless others. Though life doesn't always give us good times, I am so thankful for the saving grace of our Heavenly Father and how good He is. I carry the attribute of trustworthiness that God provides, knowing His way is better and all moments will be used for my good. I move forward through constant surrender, taking thoughts captive, and knowing that although we are flawed, God will never let us down. He always has and always will look out for both you and me. I hope my story is proof of His living word, so actively able to change hearts and perspectives when our foundation is grounded in His love.
