

e started The Jairus Project in March 2025 in an effort to posture ourselves with open hands and our heart toward God - expectant of the future He has for Oasis Church. When we look at the story of Jairus in Luke 8, we meet a man who had deep faith in Jesus and His transforming power to bring life and healing, worked for the local church (involved in facilities), and had a deep sincere love for his daughter-- the next generation.

This is The Jairus Project: a three year commitment to what God is doing in and through Oasis Church, as we grow together in our faith, expand the facilities of Oasis Church, and create a lasting legacy for the next generation of Jesus-followers.

Our hope and prayer is that God would use The Jairus Project to deepen our affection for Him, for His church, and for His will in our lives and in our community. We desire 100% participation in The Jairus Project from everyone who calls Oasis Church home, because we know that it takes all of us, united together to reflect the mission of God in our world.

We're asking that everyone reading this participates in praying these three prayers, daily, for the next three months.

Pray for your faith. **God, I want more of You.** When we open our hearts for more of God, we find that He meets us in our longing. When we have more of God, our desires mold to His desires, and guide our steps as we walk forward in The Jairus Project.

Pray for our facilities. **God, may Oasis Church have Your favor.** As we navigate the next phase of construction and preparations, we don't want to do this without God and His favor. May He go before us and prepare a way with the Town of Holly Springs, our developers, and all of the logistics involved in the undertaking of a project of this size.

Pray for the next generation. **God, show me how I can leave a legacy of faith for the next generation.** May we be a people not consumed by what's in it for us, but with a deep desire to see generations and generations come to know new life in Christ.

Make a plan to pray these three prayers daily. Set a timer on your phone to remind you. Write them on a sticky note and put it on your steering wheel or bathroom mirror. Make these prayers repeat in your heart, mind, and tongue throughout the day - God, I want more of You. May Oasis have Your favor. Show me how I can leave a legacy for the next generation. Amen.

Based on the original timeline, we should have completed the construction work in October 2023. However, due to complicated factors involving the road work on the other


side of the street with the ongoing residential development, NCDOT did not allow us to do our project work on the road -- thus giving us an extended warranty on our timeline arrangement with the Town of Holly Springs.

As you look out today and see progress being made, we are reminded of God's perfect timing and how He continues to work all things together. The road widening project is shaping up to be completed right as we hit the 5 year mark we originally requested, also as we begin to approach Phase II construction.



One of the earliest commitments that Oasis made to the Town of Holly Springs during the due diligence period of buying our property on Ralph Stephens Road was to complete the vision that the Town staff had for the thoroughfare. We had every intention to follow through with widening the road as soon as possible. However, the large cost for this small portion of the project that seemingly would not be of much benefit to us as property owners was an obstacle. Through a series of meetings and conversations, our developers requested that Phase II development would be contingent on these off-site improvements being completed. We were hoping not to have a countdown clock attached to the project. When the Town wanted a timeline commitment to when the work would be done, we requested five years to complete the work -- giving us ample time to raise the funds necessary to complete the work without having to borrow additional funds, but that was also denied. In April of 2021, we ultimately reached an understanding that we would follow through on the road widening within two years of the Town Council's approval, and the countdown began.


In March 2025, we launched The Jairus Project – a three year financial commitment to what God is doing in and through Oasis Church to prepare for the future God has planned for us. Between first radical gifts to help cash flow the Ralph Stephens Road road widening project and regular, recurring gifts of generosity, the Building Fund is growing.

Two-thirds of the contributions to The Jairus Project thus far have been connected to pledges, with one-third of the gifts coming without pledges. While we celebrate and appreciate the generosity of all contributions, pledges help us better determine how we can plan for our future growth and establish a more realistic timeline for what's ahead.

We're well on our way to pursuing our expansion and as we continue toward our goal, we're asking for 100% participation from everyone who calls Oasis Church home. 






SECOND PHASE

FIRST LOOK



The Phase II building expansion will be adjacent to our current building. Where we currently gather on Sunday mornings will be transformed into a space for the next generation, with adult auditorium space moving into the Phase II area. We are building a larger space for you and for our community as we present Jesus to those who don't know Him and pursue Him with those who do. Imagine what it would

look like to gather with hundreds of others each Sunday – singing in worship, diving deeper into God's Word, and cultivating a life centered around Jesus together. Imagine the faith in the room. Imagine what God will do in this space and through the people in these seats.



It's fun and exciting to think about our future building space. With digital renderings, we're able to really imagine what it would look like to open the doors of Phase II for the first time. While we don't yet know the exact finalized layout of our future Phase II, we do know that we want to continue to create environments that allow all people to experience new life in Christ - all generations, all ethnicities, all socioeconomic backgrounds, all past experiences.

Can you imagine yourself in this space, walking through the front doors? Who are you meeting in this space – your neighbor? Your boss? Your children? Your children's children? We see a multi-ethnic, multi-generational church that is rooted in God's Word, flourishing in the fruit of the Holy Spirit, and making a significant difference in our community. This space is a gathering place for us to come together to deepen our affection for Jesus and strengthen our faith, and also the place we go out of into our community and everyday lives – carrying and reflecting the love of Jesus with us each step of the way.



Growing up as an inner-city kid in the Bronx, NY, it was customary to attend Catholic school because it was considered safer than public school. I went to Catholic school and received all the sacraments required - baptism, communion, and confirmation - but I could never say I actually knew who God was. I had heard of God, been told He loved me, and knew that Christ died for my sins, but I didn't have a personal relationship with God the Father.

My parents divorced and both remarried when I was very young. Almost simultaneously, both began attending separate Christian churches. Between a large Bible church with my dad, a small charismatic church with my mom, and the Catholic services required by my school, my church experience was - to say the least - extremely diverse. I was eager to learn more about God and Jesus. I soaked up every Bible story I could, began memorizing Scripture, and developing a personal prayer life. At ten, I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior and I still remember the certificate I received when I accepted Christ - 2 Corinthians 5:20, KJV:

"Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us; we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled by God." Something inside me changed. I felt renewed and different.

Fast forward to high school: I attended church and faith remained a significant part of my life, but church attendance became less frequent. In college, everything changed. I spiraled downward for about two years with poor relationship choices and hanging with the wrong crowd. Yet during that time, I never felt that God had left me, even though I had created distance between us.

At 21, I met my now-husband, Joe. Like me, he grew up Catholic and knew little about God. We fell in love quickly, and I left my wild days behind. We married, moved to Long Island, and began our family. I knew I wanted my children to know the Jesus I knew growing up, so I shared Bible stories with them and talked about God - but we didn't attend church. Something was still missing.

In 2006, when our second child "Jojo" turned one, we decided to relocate to North Carolina because New York had become too expensive for a family. We didn't know anything about North Carolina - but something drew us there. When we arrived, we fell in love with the area. I noticed all of the churches in the area, and my friend Sonia and I decided to try church together. I quickly felt God's presence in a local church that became home for our family - we attended for almost 15 years. Joe accepted the Lord, my children and I were baptized, we joined a small group, and we all served in various capacities of ministry.

In 2020, the world stopped. COVID forced us to attend church online. Our faith remained strong, but lacked substance and community. By the end of 2021, I was hungry to return to in-person church. I was craving community.



My best friend Sonia had been attending Oasis, so I joined her one baptism Sunday. One after one, people were baptized and you could feel the overwhelming presence of the Lord in that place. I could not stop crying. Tears just kept streaming down my face and at that moment I knew this is where I belonged. I knew at that moment that the Lord was at work here. There was also excitement in the church as they were preparing to move to the new building. I felt like I was a part of something big and I was excited to be a small part of it. Our faith was reignited. The welcoming people, powerful sermons, and sense of community drew me back to God. My parents finally retired and relocated from NY to NC and now call Oasis their church home, too.

Had the Holy Spirit not prompted our move to North Carolina, I wholeheartedly believe my husband, my children, and I would be totally different people. I don't know if we had still been living in NY if we ever would have decided to visit a church. What would my life look like had I completely walked away from God?

God has walked alongside me my whole life even when I pushed Him away. He knew that moving to NC is where we needed to be. He has brought the most amazing friends in my life - women of faith that I can call in a heartbeat for prayer.

There have been several times on Sundays that I look across the aisle and just well up inside with gratitude, being able to fill up a row with my family and friends. I am so humbled and honored to be able to worship and serve alongside my family.

After losing my mom, I have become aware of the concept of time. Tomorrow is not promised and I don't know what the future holds. My parents are aging, my kids are growing up, I am growing older. It's important to me to know that my future is secure in heaven. I hope and pray that what has been passed down to me will be passed on to my kid's children and generations to come. If there is a legacy to leave, let it be that we were a family that loved the Lord.

We are far from perfect, but we serve a perfect God who we can put our trust in no matter the circumstances. I pray that Oasis will continue to be a home for families to grow and serve the Lord with their families and be a multi-generational church for years to come.
